An increasing number of Illinois projects are pursuing High Performance due to increasingly stringent energy Codes and certification programs. With this, comes the use of sophisticated modeling tools to unlock the potential of projects, validate savings goals for politicians and confirm results, often within a short timeframe.

This workshop will introduce participants to a practical process to break-down complexity into a manageable effort to instill confidence in all parties. Real world case studies are used to solidify course concepts with participants engaging in mock reviews.

- Understand key motivations for choosing the performance path;
- Comprehend the differences between energy code compliance and LEED models;
- Identify basic submission requirements;
- Know what types of questions to ask for resubmittal;
- Read/Interpret basic energy simulation results;
- Gain the tools to quickly check validity of LEED submissions
